Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school district is required to hold school for at least 180 days each school year, less any days on which school is closed because of inclement weather and any days on which parent–teacher conferences are held, not to exceed 5 days in any school year.

This bill deletes the exception for inclement weather. Under the bill, a school district must hold school for at least 180 days each school year, less any days on which parent-teacher conferences are held, not to exceed 5 days in any school year.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 115.01 (10) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:
- 115.01 (10) (a) 1. Days on which school is closed by order of the school district
 administrator because of inclement weather and days on which parent-teacher
 conferences are held, not to exceed 5 days during the school term.
