

## **1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 644**

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, a reference in a will to another document that lists property disposes of that property if the other document fulfills certain requirements.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 853.16 of the statutes is created to read:

4 **853.16 Effect of reference to another document. (1)** A reference in a will

5 executed on or after the effective date of this subsection .... [revisor inserts date], to

6 another document that lists tangible personal property not otherwise specifically

7 disposed of in the will disposes of that property if the other document describes the

8 property and the distributees with reasonable certainty and is signed and dated by

- 9 the decedent.
- 10 (2) Another document under sub. (1) is valid even if it does not exist when the

11 will is executed, even if it is changed after the will is executed and even if it has no

12 significance except for its effect on the disposition of property by the will.

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
