## 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 66

January 26, 1995 – Introduced by Representatives Baldus, Gronemus, Hutchison, Wilder, Ladwig, Boyle, Plombon, R. Young, L. Young, Hasenohrl, Notestein, Kreuser, Robson and Bell, cosponsored by Senators Clausing, Wineke, Decker, Moen, Chvala, Jauch and Burke. Referred to Committee on Agriculture.

- AN ACT to create 97.25 (5) of the statutes; relating to: sale of dairy cows that
- 2 have been administered synthetic bovine growth hormone.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a person selling a dairy cow that was administered synthetic bovine growth hormone within 60 days before the day of the sale to notify the buyer in writing, before the sale, of the last date on which the cow was administered synthetic bovine growth hormone.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 97.25 (5) of the statutes is created to read:
- 97.25 (5) NOTIFYING PURCHASERS. Any person selling a dairy cow that was administered synthetic bovine growth hormone within 60 days before the day of the sale shall notify the buyer in writing, before the sale, of the last date on which the cow was administered synthetic bovine growth hormone.
