February 26, 1996 – Introduced by Representatives MURAT, BALDUS, GOETSCH, DOBYNS, FREESE, KLUSMAN and AINSWORTH, cosponsored by Senators BURKE and MOEN. Referred to Committee on Highways and Transportation.

monitoring devices or video equipment used by police vehicles.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law imposes certain restrictions on a motorist having any object within or upon a vehicle that obstructs the motorist's clear view through the front windshield or rear window of the vehicle. These restrictions do not apply to lamps on authorized emergency vehicles that are used solely to activate traffic control signal preemption devices.

This bill provides that these restrictions on objects within or upon vehicles do not apply to traffic speed monitoring devices or video equipment used by police vehicles.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 346.88 (3) (d) of the statutes is amended to read:

- 4 346.88 (3) (d) Signal lamps used by authorized emergency vehicles, or traffic
- 5 <u>speed monitoring devices or video equipment used by police vehicles</u>, shall not be
- 6 considered a violation of this section.
