 $\mathbf{2}$ Whereas, Jerry Wing was born in Appleton on June 21, 1923, and died in 3 Naples, Florida, on July 18, 1994; and Whereas, he served in the Air Force during World War II, and 4 Whereas, he was a founding partner of the W.B. Bottle Supply Company; and 5 6 Whereas, Mr. Wing was elected to the assembly in 1968 and served diligently on the Commerce and Manufactures Committee, the Conservation Committee, the 7 8 State Affairs Committee and the Legislative Programs Study Committee; and 9 Whereas, Mr. Wing was described by the Green Bay Press Gazette in 1970 as 10 the "most determined individualist in the Wisconsin Legislature" after he left the 11 Republican party and became an Independent; and 12 Whereas, Mr. Wing followed his principles, seeking reelection in 1970 as an

Independent and losing eventually to Democrat James A. Rutkowski; and

Whereas, Mr. Wing traveled widely after he left the legislature and remained very active as President of W. B. Bottle Supply Co. until his retirement in 1988; now, therefore, be it
