

1995 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 72

January 16, 1996 - Introduced by Representative Lorge. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: the life and public service of Gerald K. Anderson.
2	Whereas, Gerald K. Anderson was born on April 26, 1921, in the town of
3	Waupaca and died on November 3, 1995, in Waupaca; and
4	Whereas, he received a B.A. degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison
5	in 1942 and a LL.B. degree from that university in 1948; and
6	Whereas, he served in the U.S. armed forces in World War II; and
7	Whereas, after he completed his education he practiced law and was the
8	attorney for Manawa from 1948 to 1960 and Waupaca County district attorney from
9	1954 to 1960, from 1962 to 1964 and from 1971 to 1980; and
10	Whereas, Mr. Anderson was elected to the assembly in 1964 and reelected in
11	1966; and
12	Whereas, he was a member of, and later chairperson of, the Judiciary
13	Committee and also served on the Contingent Expenditures Committee, the
14	Veterans and Military Affairs Committee and the Legislative Council Judiciary
15	Committee; now, therefore, be it
16	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the
17	legislature of the state of Wisconsin salute the many decades of devoted and effective

public service that Gerald K. Anderson performed for the people of this state, express
their sorrow at his death and extend their condolences to his family and friends; and,
be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint
resolution to Mr. Anderson's wife, Betty, and to his daughters: Mary Beth Anderson,
Kaye E. Anderson and Jill A. Anderson.
