1995 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 8

January 9, 1995 – Introduced by Representatives Kaufert, Gunderson, Hoven, Green, Ladwig, Nass, Olsen, Powers and Albers. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

1 **Relating to:** requesting Congress to grant to the President the authority to 2 line-item veto legislation. 3 Whereas, our system of government relies on the 3 branches of government balancing one another in their actions and powers; and 4 5 Whereas, 42 states allow their governors the power to line-item veto 6 legislation; and 7 Whereas, a line-item veto provides the executive branch with the flexibility it may need to deal with legislation presented to it by the legislative branch; and 8 9 Whereas, a line-item veto permits the executive to eliminate portions of 10 legislative proposals; and 11 Whereas, a line-item veto can be an important tool in the reduction of excessive 12 government spending; and 13 Whereas, Wisconsin has been particularly well-served by its partial veto, 14 which is limited to appropriations bills and allows the governor to reduce 15 appropriations; now, therefore, be it Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the 16

legislature of the state of Wisconsin do entreat Congress to provide line-item veto

- authority to the President of the United States, so that such a veto may have as beneficial an effect on federal lawmaking as it has had on state lawmaking; and, be it further

 Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint
 - **Resolved, That** the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to each member of this state's congressional delegation.
