

1995 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 88

March 12, 1996 - Introduced by Representatives Musser, Huebsch and Gard, cosponsored by Senators Moen and Rude.

1	Relating to: the life and public service of Kyle Kenyon.
2	Whereas, Kyle Kenyon was born in Wyeville, Wisconsin, on March 22, 1924, and
3	died at his home on Wednesday, March 6, 1996; and
4	Whereas, he graduated from Tomah High School and the University of
5	Wisconsin Law School and practiced law for 45 years; and
6	Whereas, Kyle Kenyon served 7 terms in the Wisconsin state assembly,
7	representing the citizens of the 92nd assembly district from 1957 to 1970; and
8	Whereas, Kyle Kenyon served as the assistant republican leader and on
9	numerous prominent committees in the Wisconsin legislature; and
10	Whereas, Kyle Kenyon was a World War II veteran, having served in the U.S.
11	army and army air corps from 1943 to 1946; and
12	Whereas, he served as the Monroe County Veterans Service Officer for $12~{\rm years}$
13	and as a family court commissioner for Monroe County; and
14	Whereas, Kyle Kenyon was an active member of numerous veteran and local
15	civic organizations, to which he selflessly contributed and gave back to his
16	community; now, therefore, be it
