1 AN ACT *to create* 97.03 (1) (am) of the statutes; **relating to:** tampering with expiration dates on foods.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may sell a food item if it is misbranded. A food item is misbranded if its labeling or packaging contains misleading or inaccurate information such an inaccurate statement as to quantity or quality. Under this bill, a food item is misbranded if its expiration date has been tampered with, obscured or altered with the intent to mislead another person.
