

1997 ASSEMBLY BILL 484

August 26, 1997 – Introduced by Representative OTT, cosponsored by Senator A. LASEE. Referred to Joint committee on Finance.

1 AN ACT to create 101.143 (4) (d) 2. e. of the statutes; relating to: reimbursement

2 of costs incurred because of discharges from certain underground petroleum

3 storage tanks in the village of Mount Calvary.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of commerce administers a program to reimburse owners of certain petroleum product storage tanks for a portion of the costs of cleaning up discharges from those tanks. This program is commonly known as PECFA. The maximum PECFA reimbursement for one contaminated area is \$1,000,000.

This bill increases the maximum PECFA reimbursement to \$2,000,000 for an area in the village of Mount Calvary that was contaminated by a petroleum product discharge.
