## 1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 127

March 25, 1998 - Introduced by Representatives Hoven, Otte, Grothman, Baumgart and Lorge, cosponsored by Senators Panzer and C. Potter. Referred to Committee on Rules.

2	Whereas, Curtis McKay was born on October 10, 1926, in Chicago and died on
3	March 23, 1998, in Sheboygan; and
4	Whereas, he received his undergraduate degree from Grinnell College and a
5	law degree from Northwestern University; and
6	Whereas, he practiced law in Milwaukee and Chicago; and
7	Whereas, he was elected to the assembly in 1960 and reelected in 1962, 1964
8	and 1966; and
9	Whereas, he served as assistant majority leader for one session and as majority
10	leader for one session; and
11	Whereas, Mr. McKay was a delegate to 3 Republican National Conventions,
12	served on the State Elections Board, was a member of the Bay Lakes Regional
13	Planning Commission and was the legal counsel for the Management Trustees of the
14	Wisconsin State Laborers' Pension and Employment Fund; and

Relating to: the life and public service of Curtis McKay.

1 Whereas, he was the chairman of the board and general counsel of Kohler  $\mathbf{2}$ General Corporation from 1980 until his retirement in 1995; and 3 Whereas, Mr. McKay was an avid flyer from the age of 14 and owned a 4 twin-engine Cessna aircraft; now, therefore, be it 5 Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the 6 Wisconsin legislature salute the many years of effective public service that Curtis 7 McKay rendered to the people of this state, express their sorrow at his death and 8 extend their condolences to his family and friends; and, be it further 9 **Resolved, That** the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to Mr. McKay's wife, Ruth, and to his children; Thomas McKay, Joan 10 11 Winters-Nisewander, Janet Haupt and Kimberly Schmidt.
