1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 13

January 23, 1997 – Introduced by Representative Hoven, cosponsored by Senator Panzer. Referred to Committee on Rules.

Relating to: the life and public service of William Double.

2	Whereas, William Double was born on June 12, 1910, in Milwaukee, and died
3	on December 28, 1996, in Mequon; and
4	Whereas, Mr. Double graduated from Bay View High School in Milwaukee,
5	attended Ripon College and Marquette University and earned a law degree from
6	Marquette University; and
7	Whereas, after practicing law, he was elected to the assembly in 1938 and
8	served 3 terms; and
9	Whereas, among Mr. Double's major accomplishments in the assembly were
10	appointment as chair of the Municipalities Committee and primary authorship of the
11	first variable rate mortgage statute in this country; and
12	Whereas, after leaving the assembly Mr. Double practiced law, served as a
13	lobbyist for the Wisconsin Savings and Loan League, was a director of the St. Francis
14	Bank and was elected the first president of the Milwaukee Exchange Club; and
15	Whereas, he also served in the Wisconsin National Guard and the Temporary
16	Coast Guard Reserve; now, therefore, be it
