## 1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 29

February 18, 1997 – Introduced by Representatives Schneider, Kreuser, Krug, Dueholm, Olsen, Turner, Otte, Porter, Handrick, Skindrud, Seratti, Urban, Black, Notestein, Baldwin, Hahn, R. Potter, Musser, Gronemus, R. Young, Plale, Zukowski, Williams and Hasenohrl, cosponsored by Senators Wineke, Jauch, Plache, Cowles and Schultz. Referred to Committee on State-Federal Relations.

Relating to: memorializing Congress to pass legislation requiring professional 1 2 sports leagues to permit community ownership of their franchises. 3 Whereas, professional sports leagues set conditions on the ownership of their franchises: and 4 5 Whereas, the leagues may forbid community ownership of franchises and some 6 leagues have done so; and 7 Whereas, the Green Bay Packers, a community-owned franchise, has 8 conclusively demonstrated the advantages of that kind of ownership, including 9 abolition of the possibility of moving the franchise and of the possibility of operating 10 the franchise in ways that harm the community; and 11 Whereas, the Packers have also demonstrated that community-owned teams can be financially robust and highly successful on the playing field; now, therefore, 12be it 13 14

**Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the members of the Wisconsin legislature urge Congress to enact legislation to require all professional sports leagues to allow community-owned franchises; and, be it further

  resolution to each member of this state's congressional delegation.
