## **1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 31**

February 24, 1997 – Introduced by Representatives Johnsrud, Skindrud, Murat, Ward, Hanson, Black, Urban, Dobyns, Krug, L. Young, Owens, Lorge, Musser, Ryba, Baldwin, R. Potter, Olsen, Hahn and Gunderson, cosponsored by Senators Rude, Grobschmidt, Moen, Buettner and Huelsman. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: proclaiming May 16, 17 and 18, 1997, Syttende Mai Weekend.
2	Whereas, Norway, which means "Northern Way", is the 5th largest country in
3	Europe, covering 125,052 square miles, and has a population of approximately
4	4,000,000; and
5	Whereas, Norwegian immigrants have made countless contributions to the
6	cultures of Wisconsin and other regions of the United States; and
7	Whereas, "Syttende Mai", Norwegian for "May 17" celebrates the anniversary
8	of the 1814 signing of the Norwegian Constitution that declared Norway's
9	independence from Denmark; and
10	Whereas, Wisconsin communities, such as Stoughton, Blair, Westby and
11	Woodville, will celebrate "Syttende Mai" in many ways, including parades,
12	Norwegian displays, Norwegian street music and dancers, "Syttende Mai" King and
13	Queen presentations, "Syttende Mai" runs, special museum tours, choral concerts,
14	church services and Norwegian drama; and

1 Whereas, thousands of Wisconsin citizens of Norwegian heritage will 2 participate in these activities during the month of May; now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That* the weekend of
May 16, 17 and 18, 1997, is proclaimed "Syttende Mai Weekend" in the state of
Wisconsin, and that all of the citizens of this state are declared honorary Norwegians
for that weekend and are urged to observe the "Syttende Mai Weekend" with
appropriate celebrations.
