Relating to: proclaiming Native American History Month.

Whereas, among the residents of Wisconsin are members of the Ojibwe, Potawatomi, Stockbridge–Munsee, Menominee, Oneida and Ho–Chunk tribes, as well as individuals of other Native American nations from across the United States; and

Whereas, these Native American tribes have a long and important history; and Whereas, that history is taught in Wisconsin public schools, and the Department of Public Instruction has created curricular materials to assist the teachers of that subject; and

Whereas, providing accurate historical information about Native Americans to

Whereas, integration of material on Native American history into the schools' curricula also increases the pride that Native American children have in their rich cultural traditions; now, therefore, be it
