1	Relating to: commemorating the achievements and contributions of Wisconsin's 6
2	Vietnam veterans who were awarded the Medal of Honor.
3	Whereas, the Medal of Honor is the highest recognition given by this nation to
4	members of the U.S. armed forces; and
5	Whereas, of the 165,400 Wisconsin men and women who served their nation
6	during the Vietnam War, only 6 were recognized with this honor; and
7	Whereas, this year marks the 25th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War;
8	and
9	Whereas, Gary Wetzel was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions in 1968
10	when, according to his citation, he "distinguished himself by conspicuous gallantry
11	and intrepidity at the risk of his life"; and
12	Whereas, Harold Fritz was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions in 1969
13	when, according to his citation, he "armed only with a pistol and bayonet, led a small
14	group of his men in a fierce and daring charge which routed the attackers and
15	inflicted heavy casualties"; and

1	Whereas, Kenneth Stumpf was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions in
2	1967 when he brought 3 wounded men to safety while under fire and then destroyed
3	an enemy bunker; and
4	Whereas, Robert Modrzejewski was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions
5	in 1966 when he helped capture a large cache of enemy supplies and then defended
6	the position against a much larger enemy force; and
7	Whereas, Lance Sijan was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions in 1967
8	when he was shot down over enemy territory, evaded capture for many weeks,
9	refused to provide information to his captors once he was captured despite torture
10	and other deprivations, and died in captivity in 1968; and
11	Whereas, Leslie Bellrichard was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions
12	in1967 when he threw himself on a live grenade in his foxhole during intense fighting
13	with the enemy, thus sacrificing his life to save the lives of his fellow soldiers; now,
14	therefore, be it
15	Resolved by the assembly, That the members of the Wisconsin assembly
16	salute Wisconsin's 6 Vietnam War Medal of Honor awardees for their bravery and
17	service to their nation; and, be it further
18	<i>Resolved, That</i> the assembly chief clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution
19	to Gary Wetzel, Harold Fritz, Kenneth Stumpf, Robert Modrzejewski and the
20	families of Lance Sijan and Leslie Bellrichard.
