Thompson, and held that position until his 8 retirement on March 10, 2001; and Whereas, Joe Leean was the second longest serving secretary of health and 9 10 family services since the creation of the department in 1967; and 11 Whereas, since becoming secretary of health and family services, Joe Leean has worked on many major new programs, including "BadgerCare," which provides 12

health care for low-income working families, and "Family Care," which is a major
