## 2001 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 33

February 19, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives Carpenter, Turner and La Fave. Referred to Committee on Rules.

- **To create** joint rule 46m; **relating to:** preparation of additional local fiscal estimates
- 2 by the legislative fiscal bureau.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Joint Rule 46m: The rule is created to require the legislative fiscal bureau, independently of the preparation of any other local fiscal estimate by a state agency, to prepare an original local fiscal estimate on any bill requiring a local fiscal estimate. The legislative fiscal bureau is directed to consult with local governmental officials and employees in preparing the local fiscal estimate. Bills requiring local fiscal estimates under this rule may not be considered by the senate or assembly, and may receive neither a public hearing nor be considered by a senate or assembly standing committee, before the receipt of the local fiscal estimate prepared under this rule.

## Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That:

- **SECTION 1.** Joint rule 46m is created to read:
- 5 Joint Rule 46m. Additional local fiscal estimates. (1) The legislative fiscal
- 6 bureau, independently of the preparation of any other local fiscal estimate by a state
- 7 agency, shall prepare an additional original local fiscal estimate on any bill requiring
- 8 a local fiscal estimate.

- (2) The legislative fiscal bureau shall consult with local governmental officials and employees in preparing the local fiscal estimate under sub. (1).
- (3) An original fiscal estimate prepared under sub. (1) shall be submitted to the legislative reference bureau for review by the requester under joint rule 48 and for reproduction and insertion in the bill jacket envelope.
- (4) Bills requiring local fiscal estimates under this rule may not be considered by the senate or assembly, and may receive neither a public hearing nor be considered by a senate or assembly standing committee, before the receipt of the local fiscal estimate prepared under this rule.
- (5) Any member may, at any time that a bill is before the senate or assembly, raise the issue that the bill requires a local fiscal estimate prepared under this rule, and if the presiding officer determines that the bill, not having the estimate, requires an estimate, the presiding officer shall direct the legislative fiscal bureau to prepare the requisite estimate.
- (6) Local fiscal estimates prepared under this rule are required on original bills only and not on substitute amendments or amendments.
