13	Resolved, That the Wisconsin State Legislature salutes the unity and
14	patriotism of the American people, who hold diverse religious beliefs and represent
15	diverse ethnic heritages; and, be it further
16	Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin State Legislature call upon the
17	people of Wisconsin to join with them in supporting the brave men and women in our
18	Armed Forces as they carry out their noble mission to rid the world of the scourge
19	of terrorism.
