2	Whereas, Robert O. Uehling was born on April 23, 1915, in Wisconsin Rapids,
3	Wisconsin, and died on November 29, 2001, in Madison, Wisconsin; and
4	Whereas, Mr. Uehling graduated from Wisconsin Rapids High School, attended
5	Santa Monica Junior College, and earned both his B.A. degree in 1939 and LL.B.
6	degree in 1941 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison; and
7	Whereas, Mr. Uehling served his country with the U.S. Army during World War
8	II as a forward observer with the 45th Infantry Division artillery in North Africa,
9	Anzio, Italy, and southern France; and
10	Whereas, he was awarded the Bronze Star for "Heroism in Ground Combat
11	while near Fremifontaine, France, in October 1944"; and
12	Whereas, prior to going overseas during World War II, Mr. Uehling married
13	Dorothy Knauss, who preceded him in death in 1986 after they celebrated 43 years
14	of togetherness; and

1	Whereas, Mr. Uehling also served from 1952 to 1957 as an administrative
2	officer of the state Selective Service System, and retired as a colonel from the
3	Wisconsin National Guard; and
4	Whereas, he received his first taste of an elected office with a stint on the
5	Madison city council from 1959 to 1961; and
6	Whereas, Mr. Uehling was first elected to the Wisconsin assembly in 1960, and
7	served continuously from the 1961 through the 1969 sessions; and
8	Whereas, after his tenure in the assembly, Mr. Uehling was appointed chief
9	clerk of the Wisconsin Supreme Court, by the court, in 1973, and served in that
10	position from September 1, 1973, to January 1978; and
11	Whereas, Mr. Uehling married Eleanor Jane Crawford in 1987; and, be it

13	Resolved by the assembly assembly senate concurring, That the members
14	of the Wisconsin legislature commend the devoted public service that Robert O.
15	Uehling contributed to this state and his community, express their sorrow at his
16	death, and extend their condolences to his family and friends; and, be it further
17	Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint
18	resolution to Mr. Uehling's wife, Eleanor Jane Crawford Uehling; to his two sons,
19	Robert H. Uehling of Capitola, California, and Richard A. Uehling of Sausalito,
