



## 2001 SENATE BILL 14

January 12, 2001 - Introduced by Senators WELCH and DARLING, cosponsored by Representatives OWENS, SUDER, SYKORA, LADWIG, OLSEN, HUNDERTMARK, ALBERS, KREIBICH, OTT, TOWNSEND, BALOW, KESTELL and LASSA. Referred to Committee on Labor and Agriculture.

- 1     **AN ACT to create** 106.01 (11) of the statutes; **relating to:** apprenticeship training  
2             and making appropriations.

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### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) may determine reasonable apprenticeship classifications, promulgate rules, issue general or special orders, hold hearings, make findings, and render orders as necessary to oversee the apprenticeship programs provided in this state.

This bill directs DWD to provide a trade masters pilot program to recognize advanced training and postapprenticeship achievements in three trades, crafts, or businesses, one of which must be in the industrial sector, one in the construction sector, and one in the service sector of the economy. In addition, the bill provides funding for the provision of that program and for promotional materials directed at encouraging youth to participate in apprenticeship programs. Finally, the bill requires DWD to submit to the legislature, by July 1, 2005, an evaluation of the effectiveness of the trade masters pilot program in producing workers with advanced skills beyond the apprentice level.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

**SENATE BILL 14**

1           **SECTION 1.** 106.01 (11) of the statutes is created to read:

2           106.01 (11) The department shall provide a trade masters pilot program to  
3 recognize advanced training and postapprenticeship achievements in 3 trades,  
4 crafts, or businesses, one of which shall be in the industrial sector, one in the  
5 construction sector, and one in the service sector of the economy. By July 1, 2005, the  
6 department shall submit to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) an evaluation of the  
7 effectiveness of the pilot program in producing workers with advanced skills beyond  
8 the apprentice level.

9           **SECTION 2. Appropriation changes.**

10           (1) TRADE MASTERS PILOT PROGRAM. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of  
11 the statutes for the appropriation to the department of workforce development under  
12 section 20.445 (1) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2001, the dollar amount  
13 is increased by \$175,000 for fiscal year 2001-02 to provide the trade masters pilot  
14 program under section 106.01 (11) of the statutes, as created by this act.

15           (2) APPRENTICESHIP PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS. In the schedule under section  
16 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of workforce  
17 development under section 20.445 (1) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of  
18 2001, the dollar amount is increased by \$125,000 for fiscal year 2001-02 to provide  
19 promotional materials directed at encouraging youth to participate in  
20 apprenticeship programs.

21           **SECTION 3. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the day after publication,  
22 except as follows:

23           (1) SECTION 2 (1) and (2) of this act takes effect on the 2nd day after publication  
24 of the 2001-03 biennial budget act.
