This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA), in cooperation with the Department of Military Affairs (DMA), to administer a program that encourages and provides public recognition to private businesses that show exceptional support for veterans, members of the national guard, and members of the U.S. reserves. In addition, the bill requires DVA, in cooperation with DMA, to administer a program that encourages and provides public recognition to merchants who agree to give discounts on products and services to veterans, members of the national guard, and members of the U.S. reserves.
