

2003 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 12

January 30, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives MORRIS, YOUNG, A. WILLIAMS, COGGS and TURNER, cosponsored by Senators George and Moore. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: declaring February African–American History and Cultural Heritage
2	Month.
3	Whereas, we acknowledge and honor the estimated 11,000,000 to 12,000,000
4	African men, women, and children who were forcibly embarked on European vessels
5	for a life of slavery in the Western Hemisphere and the 9,000,000 to 10,000,000
6	enslaved African survivors of the Middle Passage to America; and
7	Whereas, throughout the struggle, African–Americans have maintained a rich,
8	distinctive culture and have made major contributions to the American culture and
9	the world; and
10	Whereas, through the contributions of such African-Americans as Harriet
11	Tubman, Sojourner Truth, Fredrick Douglas, W.E.B. Du Bois, Booker T. Washington,
12	Thurgood Marshall, Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Fannie Lou Hamer, Malik El
13	Shabazz, Shirley Chisholm, Lloyd A. Barbee, and James Cameron, the founder of the
14	first and only Black holocaust museum in the United States (located in Milwaukee),

America's views of itself and of the world have grown to incorporate new ideas and
 directions; and

Whereas, through the contributions of African-American musicians and writers such as Louis Armstrong, Count Basie, Duke Ellington, Billie Holiday, Charlie Parker, Ella Fitzgerald, Dizzy Gillespie, Leontyne Price, Marian Anderson, Andre Watts, Aaliyah, Phyllis Wheatley, Langston Hughes, James Baldwin, Richard Wright, Alex Haley, Maya Angelou, and Toni Morrison, the American culture has been enriched and appreciated around the world; and

9 Whereas, African-American sports figures, such as Tommy Smith, John 10 Carlos, Muhammad Ali, Tiger Woods, Venus Williams, and Serena Williams, have 11 demonstrated their ability to be role models on and off the field and in and out of the 12 ring when they stood up for their rights and beliefs; and

Whereas, through the contributions of such African-Americans as Dr. Charles
Drew, Dr. Daniel Hale Williams, George Washington Carver, Dr. Mae C. Jemison,
and Garrett Morgan, the worlds of medicine, science, and technology were advanced;
and

Whereas, African-Americans have kept alive and derived pride and unity from
their history and other aspects of their cultural traditions; now, therefore, be it
