2003 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 49

October 6, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives Musser, Huebsch, Johnsrud and Albers, cosponsored by Senators Brown, Schultz and M. Meyer. Referred to Committee on Rules.

2 Whereas, Judge James W. Rice was born in Sparta, Wisconsin, on October 19, 3 1924, and died at his home on May 30, 2003, in Sparta, Wisconsin; and Whereas; he graduated from Sparta High School in 1942 and from the 4 5 University of Wisconsin Law School in 1950; and 6 Whereas, James W. Rice served in the United States Armed Forces in World 7 War II as a medic with the 4th Infantry Division and was awarded the Purple Heart 8 after being wounded in combat; and 9 Whereas, he married Barbara Hughes on November 21, 1953, and together 10 they raised and enjoyed their 5 children; and 11 Whereas, James W. Rice practiced law for 14 years and in 1964 was appointed 12 Monroe County circuit judge and served with fairness and understanding in that 13 position for 31 years; and

Whereas, Judge Rice always remained loyal to his hometown of Sparta and was an active and contributing member of the community; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature recognize the life and years of public service of Judge James W. Rice and acknowledge their appreciation for the contributions that he has made to our judicial system, express their sorrow at his death, and extend their condolences to his family and friends; and, be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide a copy of this joint resolution to his wife, Barbara, of Sparta; and to their children, Catherine, of New York City, New York, Elizabeth, of Oshkosh, John, of Elko, Nevada, Robert, of Salt Lake City, Utah, and Thomas, of Bluff, Utah.
