8	Whereas, Mr. Greco was first elected to the Wisconsin assembly in 1960, serving
9	in the 1961 through 1965 sessions; and
10	Whereas, during his tenure in the assembly, Mr. Greco served on the Committee
11	on Judiciary, Committee on Education, and Committee on Commerce and
12	Manufacturers and on the Building Commission; and
13	Whereas, Mr. Greco served as majority caucus chairman in the 1965 session;
