4	Whereas, Mr. Jones married Ermine Locksmith on October 11, 1941, and she
5	preceded him in death on September 21, 1995; and
6	Whereas, Mr. Jones served his country with the U.S. Army as a staff sergeant
7	during World War II and the Korean War; and
8	Whereas, Mr. Jones graduated from Antigo High School in 1932 and attended
9	Bowlby Business College, the University of Wisconsin, and Northwest University for
10	Machinists Business College; and
11	Whereas, Mr. Jones was first elected to the Wisconsin assembly in 1962, serving
12	in the 1963 to 1971 sessions; and
13	Whereas, Mr. Jones served as chairperson of the Assembly Committee on
14	Highways in the 1971 session, on the Legislative Council, and on the governor's
15	Highway Safety Task Force; and
