February 20, 2006 – Introduced by Representatives FREESE, RICHARDS, VOS, HAHN, MURSAU, BERCEAU, OTT and HINES, cosponsored by Senator RISSER. Referred to Committee on Tourism.

1 AN ACT relating to: a statewide survey to identify and document rural historic

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the State Historical Society is required to serve as the principal historic preservation agency of the state and in that capacity to carry out a program of preservation of historic properties. As part of that program, the State Historical Society is required to conduct an ongoing statewide survey to identify and document historic properties. This bill appropriates \$75,000 in each of fiscal years 2005–06 and 2006–07 for the State Historical Society to enter into a contract for a statewide survey to identify and document historic properties and document historic properties are statewide survey to identify and statewide survey to identify and document historic properties in rural areas of the state.
