Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law designates a variety of state symbols and requires the *Wisconsin Blue Book* to include information about them. This bill designates little bluestem as the Wisconsin state grass and requires the Wisconsin Blue Book to include that information.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 1.10 (3) (q) of the statutes is created to read:

- **Section 2.** 1.10 (4) of the statutes is amended to read:
