2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 218

1 AN ACT to amend 453.05 (2) (b) of the statutes; relating to: castrating a dog, cat,

2 or horse.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may castrate a dog, cat, horse, pig, goat, sheep, or head of cattle without obtaining a veterinary license. This bill requires a person to obtain a veterinary license before he or she may castrate a dog, cat, or horse.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 453.05 (2) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

- 4 453.05 (2) (b) Castrating male dogs, cats, horses, pigs, goats, sheep or cattle or
- 5 for dehorning or branding animals.
- 6
