- 1 AN ACT to amend 343.44 (2) (am) of the statutes; relating to: operating a vehicle
- 2 after revocation of a person's operating privilege and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who operates a motor vehicle when his or her operating privilege is revoked may be fined not more than \$2,500, jailed for not more than one year, or both. However, a person who operated a motor vehicle when his or her operating privilege was revoked before May 1, 2002, and who had not been convicted of a previous violation of operating a motor vehicle when his or her operating privilege had been revoked within the previous 5 years, may be required to forfeit not more than \$600.

Under this bill, any person who operates a motor vehicle when his or her operating privilege is revoked may be required to forfeit not more than \$600 unless the person has been previously convicted of operating a motor vehicle while his or her operating privilege is revoked.
