- 2 emergency telephone call and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits a person from intentionally preventing or attempting to prevent another from making a telephone call to the number "911" to report an emergency. A person who violates this prohibition is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor for which the person may be fined not more than \$1,000 or confined in jail for not more than 90 days or both.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report concerning the proposed penalty and the costs or savings that are likely to result if the bill is enacted.
