

State of Misconsin 2005 - 2006 LEGISLATURE

2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 667

September 15, 2005 – Introduced by Representatives RICHARDS, WASSERMAN, HAHN and SHERIDAN, cosponsored by Senators DARLING and PLALE. Referred to Committee on Urban and Local Affairs.

1 AN ACT *to create* 349.13 (1k) of the statutes; **relating to:** the parking of vehicles 2 on highways.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law, with certain exceptions, permits state and local highway authorities to prohibit or restrict the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on highways under their jurisdictions. This bill permits a local authority, under certain circumstances, to allow persons whose residences abut a highway, and their guests, and commercial enterprises providing services to these residents to park vehicles on the highway, or portion thereof, abutting the residences, regardless of any prohibitions or time limitations on parking. Further, the bill allows a first class city to set aside 721 parking spaces for persons whose residences are adjacent to a University of Wisconsin System college campus, their guests, and commercial enterprises providing services to these residents, if the college campus creates 721 parking spaces on campus.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 349.13 (1k) of the statutes is created to read:

1 349.13 (1k) (a) As provided in par. (b), a local authority, with respect to 2 highways under its jurisdiction including connecting highways within corporate 3 limits, may authorize persons whose residences abut a highway in a zone where 4 parking is prohibited by official signs, guests of such persons, and commercial 5 enterprises providing services to such persons to park their vehicles in the highway 6 zone without regard to the posted prohibitions.

7 (b) If a University of Wisconsin System college campus located in a 1st class city 8 creates 721 parking spaces on campus, a 1st class city may initiate a program to 9 reserve 721 parking spaces for persons whose residences are adjacent to the 10 University of Wisconsin System college campus, guests of such persons, and 11 commercial enterprises providing services to such persons. If a University of 12Wisconsin System college campus located in a 1st class city creates additional 13parking spaces on campus, a 1st class city may reserve an equal number of parking spaces for persons whose residences are adjacent to the University of Wisconsin 1415System college campus, guests of such persons, and commercial enterprises 16 providing services to such persons.
