- 1 AN ACT to create 230.38 of the statutes; relating to: removing certain written
- 2 or electronic documents from state government offices.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides that no state employee may remove from a state government office a written or electronic document containing the social security number of any person, unless the employee's duties require that the employee have the document in his or her possession outside of the office. If an employee's duties require that the employee have the document in his or her possession outside of the office, the employee may only remove the document from the office to carry out that duty. The employee must return the document to the office as soon as practicable upon completion of the duty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 3 **Section 1.** 230.38 of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 230.38 Removing documents containing social security numbers from
- 5 **state government offices.** No employee may remove from a state government
- 6 office a written or electronic document containing the social security number of any

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person, unless the employee's duties require that the employee have the document in his or her possession outside of the office. If an employee's duties require that the employee have the document in his or her possession outside of the office, the employee may only remove the document from the office to carry out that duty. The employee shall return the document to the office as soon as practicable upon completion of the duty.
