## 2007 ASSEMBLY BILL 563

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill amends the 2005–07 Authorized State Building Program to add one project for the Department of Health and Family Services. The project involves a 300–bed addition to the Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center at Mauston. The project is financed with \$34,000,000 in general fund supported borrowing.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 20.866 (2) (v) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 5 20.866 (2) (v) Health and family services; mental health and secure treatment
- 6 facilities. From the capital improvement fund, a sum sufficient for the department
- of health and family services to acquire, construct, develop, enlarge or extend mental
