3	first enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1979 and continues in the U.S. Army Reserves as
4	a colonel serving as military assistant in the Office of the Secretary of the Army at
5	the Pentagon; and
6	Whereas, John. A. Scocos first joined the Wisconsin Department of Veterans
7	Affairs in 1997 as the department's executive assistant and served as executive
8	assistant until 2001; and
9	Whereas, John A. Scocos served the legislature as a legislative assistant in the
10	senate and as sergeant-at-arms and chief clerk of the assembly; and
11	Whereas, John A. Scocos rejoined the Wisconsin Department of Veterans
12	Affairs as deputy secretary in 2002 and became secretary in 2003; and
13	Whereas, during his time as secretary, John A. Scocos worked with the
14	legislature to create and develop the new Wisconsin GI bill, the VetEd program, the

Wisconsin veterans and surviving spouses property tax credit, and numerous other
 programs that will assist veterans and their families throughout the state; and
