## 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 344

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who is subject to a fine or forfeiture for violating a state law or local ordinance is also subject to a variety of court costs, fees, and surcharges.

Under this bill, if, when a person is arrested, he or she is transported by ferry after the ferry's usual hours of operation, the person is subject to a fee that reimburses the law enforcement agency that incurred the costs of transporting the person by ferry.

arrested person to a jail or other facility, the law enforcement agency shall be reimbursed for the costs pursuant to sub. (2) it incurs to pay for the ferry transport.

(2) If a circuit court enters a judgment against a defendant who was the subject of a ferry transport described in sub. (1), the clerk of circuit court shall collect a fee equal to the costs incurred by a law enforcement agency under sub. (1). When judgment is entered against the defendant, the defendant shall pay the fee and the clerk of circuit court shall pay the law enforcement agency that requested the transport.
