

2009 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 38

April 2, 2009 – Introduced by Representative CLARK, cosponsored by Senator OLSEN. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: the life and military service of Sergeant Daniel James Thompson.
2	Whereas, Sergeant Daniel James Thompson was born August 20, 1984, in
3	Portage, Wisconsin, the son of Bob and Lisa Thompson, and died February 24, 2009,
4	from an improvised explosive device while on active duty in the Kandahar province
5	in southern Afghanistan; and
6	Whereas, Daniel graduated from Portage High School in 2003 and joined the
7	Wisconsin Army National Guard in his junior year to fight in service of his country;

9	Whereas, Daniel served with distinction during his time in the Wisconsin
10	National Guard, U.S. Army Reserve, and while on active duty with the U.S. Army;

12	Whereas, Daniel was a member of the Individual Ready Reserve and deployed
13	to Afghanistan with the 715th Military Police Company based in Melbourne, Florida;

1	Whereas, Daniel attended MATC in Portage to earn his degree in criminal
2	justice and law enforcement and hoped to enter the police force upon completion of
3	his military service; and
4	Whereas, Sergeant Thompson posthumously received the Combat Action
5	Badge, Good Conduct Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, the Purple Heart, and the
6	Bronze Star Medal in recognition of his heroism in service; and
7	Whereas, Sergeant Thompson was known by family and friends as an honest
8	and loyal person, and an ambitious and hard-working citizen, who touched the lives
9	of many people in his community; and
10	Whereas, Daniel is survived by his parents, Lisa and Bob Thompson of Portage
11	and his fiancée, Maria Steinke, whom he loved with all of his heart; and
12	Whereas, Daniel was laid to rest at Oak Hill Cemetery in Packwaukee,
13	Wisconsin, on March 4, 2009; and
14	Whereas, Sergeant Thompson faithfully served the people and the state of
15	Wisconsin and the United States of America and made the ultimate sacrifice for his
16	country to protect our freedom and way of life, while advancing the blessings of
17	liberty and democracy to the Afghani people; now, therefore, be it
18	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the
19	Wisconsin state legislature hereby commend Daniel James Thompson for his
20	exemplary life, express their sorrow at his death, and extend sincere condolences to
21	his family, friends, and colleagues; and, be it further
22	<i>Resolved, That</i> the assembly chief clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution
23	to Daniel's parents, Bob and Lisa Thompson, and to his fiancée, Maria Steinke.
