1 AN ACT to repeal 346.80 (2) (c); to amend 346.95 (1); and to create 346.94 (20)

of the statutes; **relating to:** passing parked motor vehicles and opening motor vehicle doors on highways and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, any person operating a bicycle or electric personal assistive mobility device (EPAMD) upon a roadway must exercise due care when passing a parked vehicle or a vehicle proceeding in the same direction, allowing a minimum of three feet between the bicycle or EPAMD and the vehicle and giving an audible signal when passing a bicycle or EPAMD proceeding in the same direction. This bill eliminates this requirement.

This bill also prohibits any person from opening any door of a motor vehicle located on a highway without first taking due precaution to ensure that his or her act will not interfere with the movement of traffic or endanger any other person or vehicle. A person who violates this prohibition may be required to forfeit not less than \$20 nor more than \$40 for the first offense and not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 for any subsequent conviction within a year.

door of a motor vehicle located on a highway without first taking due precaution to
ensure that his or her act will not interfere with the movement of traffic or endanger
any other person or vehicle.
Section 3. 346.95 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:
346.95 (1) Any person violating s. 346.87, 346.88, 346.89 (2), 346.90 to 346.92
or $346.94(1), (9), (10), (11), (12)$ or, (15) , or (20) may be required to forfeit not less than
\$20 nor more than $$40$ for the first offense and not less than $$50$ nor more than $$100$
for the 2nd or subsequent conviction within a year
