2009 SENATE BILL 724

December 15, 2010 – Introduced by JOINT COMMITTEE ON EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

AN ACT relating to: ratification of the agreement negotiated between the state of Wisconsin and the Professional Employees in Research, Statistics, and Analysis, AFT-Wisconsin, AFT, AFL-CIO, for the 2009-11 biennium, covering employees in the professional research, statistics, and analysis collective bargaining unit, and authorizing an expenditure of funds.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This proposal is introduced under section 111.92 (1) of the statutes. The proposal ratifies the collective bargaining contract for state employees in the professional research, statistics, and analysis collective bargaining unit negotiated for the 2009–11 biennium under the State Employment Labor Relations Act. Currently, statutory program supplement appropriations fund the costs of collective bargaining agreements to the extent that they exceed budgeted costs. The proposal authorizes expenditure of moneys from those appropriations to fund the cost of this agreement.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SENATE BILL 724

SECTION 1. Agreement ratified. The legislature ratifies the tentative 1 $\mathbf{2}$ agreement negotiated for the 2009-11 biennium between the state of Wisconsin, the 3 office of state employment relations, and the Professional Employees in Research, Statistics, and Analysis, AFT-Wisconsin, AFT, AFL-CIO, covering employees in the 4 $\mathbf{5}$ professional research, statistics, and analysis collective bargaining unit under 6 subchapter V of chapter 111 of the statutes, as approved by the employees of the 7 professional research, statistics, and analysis collective bargaining unit and 8 approved and recommended by the joint committee on employment relations, and 9 authorizes the necessary expenditure of moneys for implementation from the appropriations made by section 20.865 (1) of the statutes, subject to section 20.865 10 11 (intro.) of the statutes. The director of the office of state employment relations shall 12file an official copy of the agreement, certified by the cochairpersons of the joint 13committee on employment relations, with the secretary of state. No formal or 14informal agreement between the parties that is not a part of the official copy is 15deemed to be approved by the legislature under this act.

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SECTION 2. Effective date.

(1) This act takes effect on the day following publication, except that those
provisions specifically identified as having other effective dates in the agreement
covering employees in the professional research, statistics, and analysis collective
bargaining unit are effective on the dates provided in that agreement.
