Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law defines trafficking as recruiting, enticing, harboring, transporting, providing, or obtaining, or attempting to recruit, entice, harbor, transport, provide, or obtain, an individual without consent of the individual. This bill eliminates the element that the individual has not consented if the individual is under the age of 18.
