2013 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 119

March 18, 2014 – Introduced by Representatives Richards, Barnes, Danou, Goyke, Hintz, Johnson, Knodl, Murphy, Ohnstad, J. Ott, Pasch, Pridemore, Riemer, Sinicki, Tranel, Wright, Young and Zamarripa, cosponsored by Senators C. Larson, L. Taylor, Darling, Harris, Lazich and Lehman. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: congratulating the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Panthers
2	men's basketball team on its 2014 Horizon League title and berth to the 2014
3	NCAA Men's Division I basketball tournament.
4	Whereas, the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee Panthers men's basketball
5	team earned a berth to the 2014 NCAA Men's Division I basketball tournament; and
6	Whereas, the Panthers earned the automatic NCAA tournament berth after
7	winning the 2014 Horizon League tournament; and
8	Whereas, the Panthers won the league title with an impressive run of four wins
9	in eight days, capped by a 69–63 victory over Wright State in Dayton, Ohio; and
10	Whereas, many experts picked the Panthers to finish last in its conference this
11	year after the team finished last season with only eight wins; and
12	Whereas, Panthers senior guard Jordan Aaron was named the Horizon League
13	tournament most valuable player after finishing the tournament with 11
14	three-pointers, tying the tournament record; and

1	Whereas, Panthers senior forward Kyle Kelm, of Randolph, Wisconsin, and
2	sophomore forward Matt Tiby were named to the Horizon League all-tournament
3	team; and
4	Whereas, three of the Panthers' five starting players are from Wisconsin; and
5	Whereas, the Panthers enter the NCAA tournament with 21 wins—the fourth
6	time head coach Rob Jeter has led the team to at least 20 wins; and
7	Whereas, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee enrolls more Wisconsin
8	residents than any other four-year university and they come from every county in
9	the state; and
10	Whereas, more than 5,000 students graduate from the University of
11	Wisconsin–Milwaukee annually and more than 90 percent of those recent graduates
12	stay right here in Wisconsin, although one who left the state did go on to be named
13	the third CEO of Microsoft; now, therefore, be it
14	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the
15	Wisconsin legislature congratulate the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee
16	Panthers men's basketball team on its 2014 Horizon League title and wish the team
17	the best of luck in the NCAA Men's Division I basketball tournament.
