



2015 SENATE BILL 182

May 29, 2015 – Introduced by Senators MARKLEIN, HARSDORF, BEWLEY and GUDEX, cosponsored by Representatives NOVAK, TRANEL, E. BROOKS, KITCHENS, KULP, KRUG, T. LARSON, A. OTT, J. OTT, STEFFEN, TITTL and VORPAGEL. Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 256.15 (2); *to amend* 256.15 (2) (title) and
2 256.15 (11) (a) and (c); and *to create* 256.15 (2) (b) of the statutes; **relating to:**
3 an exemption from licensing requirements for certain out-of-state ambulance
4 service providers.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a limited exemption from licensing requirements for certain out-of-state ambulance service providers. Under current law, a person may not act as or advertise for the provision of services as an ambulance service provider unless that person holds the required Wisconsin license. This bill creates a limited exemption from that requirement for ambulance service providers licensed in another state that make ten or fewer patient transports per year that originate and terminate in Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 256.15 (2) (title) of the statutes is amended to read:
6 256.15 (2) (title) LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE REQUIRED; EXCEPTIONS.
