correctional officers who take certain other civil service positions.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides that individuals appointed to state correctional officer positions must receive all pay adjustments scheduled for correctional officers during their first two years of employment even if during that two-year period the individual is appointed to a different position whose duties include the supervision of correctional officers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 3 **SECTION 1.** 230.125 of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 **230.125 Pay adjustments for correctional officers.** (1) In this section,
