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2019 SENATE BILL 748

January 29, 2020 - Introduced by Senator KOOYENGA, cosponsored by Representatives STEFFEN, ANDERSON, CROWLEY, DITTRICH, EDMING, TUSLER and WITTKER. Referred to Committee on Universities, Technical Colleges, Children and Families.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 20.866 (1) (u); and *to create* 13.48 (46p), 20.866 (2) (zcv) and
2 20.867 (3) (cv) of the statutes; **relating to:** purchase and renovation of a center
3 for the employment of blind and visually impaired individuals, sale of the
4 existing center, granting bonding authority, and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill amends the 2019-21 Authorized State Building Program to add a grant to Wiscraft, Inc., doing business as Beyond Vision, to assist in the purchase and renovation of a new facility in Milwaukee County for the employment of blind and visually impaired individuals and the provision of related services to those individuals. The project has a combined cost of \$11,000,000 (\$5,000,000 in general fund supported borrowing authority and \$6,000,000 in gifts, grants, and other receipts). Under the bill, the Department of Administration is required to sell the existing land and facilities occupied by Wiscraft, Inc., to the highest bidder and deposit the proceeds of the sale in the budget stabilization fund.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 13.48 (46p) of the statutes is created to read:

1 13.48 **(46p)** BEYOND VISION; NEW FACILITY. (a) The legislature finds and
2 determines that the employment of individuals who are blind or visually impaired,
3 including statewide remote employment, and providing other related services to
4 those individuals, improves those individuals' lives and increases the workforce and
5 reduces unemployment in this state and is a statewide responsibility of statewide
6 dimension. It is therefore in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this
7 state, to assist Wiscraft, Inc., doing business as Beyond Vision, in the purchase and
8 renovation of a new facility in Milwaukee County, to be known as the VisABILITY
9 Center, for the employment of, and provision of other related services to, blind and
10 visually impaired individuals.

11 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$5,000,000 in general fund
12 supported borrowing to assist Wiscraft, Inc., in the purchase and renovation of a new
13 facility in Milwaukee County for the employment of, and provision of other related
14 services to, blind and visually impaired individuals. The state funding commitment
15 shall be in the form of a grant to Wiscraft, Inc. Before approving any state funding
16 commitment for the purchase and renovation of the new facility, the building
17 commission shall determine that Wiscraft, Inc., has secured additional funding for
18 the project of at least \$6,000,000 from nonstate revenue sources.

19 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to Wiscraft, Inc., under par.
20 (b) and if, for any reason, the space that is purchased and renovated with funds from
21 the grant is not used for the employment of, and provision of other related services
22 to, blind and visually impaired individuals, the state shall retain an ownership
23 interest in the renovated space equal to the amount of the state's grant.

24 **SECTION 2.** 20.866 (1) (u) of the statutes, as affected by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9,
25 is amended to read:

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1 20.866 (1) (u) *Principal repayment and interest.* A sum sufficient from moneys
2 appropriated under sub. (2) (zp) and ss. 20.115 (2) (d) and (7) (b) and (s), 20.190 (1)

8 (4) (es), (et), (ha), and (hb) and (5) (c), (g), and (kc), 20.855 (8) (a), and 20.867 (1) (a)
9 and (b) and (3) (a), (b), (bb), (bc), (bd), (be), (bf), (bg), (bh), (bj), (bL), (bm), (bn), (bq),
10 (br), (bt), (bu), (bv), (bw), (bx), (cb), (cd), (cf), (ch), (cj), (cq), (cr), (cs), (~~cv~~), (cw), (cx),
11 (g), (h), (i), (kd), and (q) for the payment of principal, interest, premium due, if any,
12 and payment due, if any, under an agreement or ancillary arrangement entered into
13 under s. 18.06 (8) (a) relating to any public debt contracted under subchs. I and IV
14 of ch. 18.

15 **SECTION 3.** 20.866 (2) (zcv) of the statutes is created to read:

16 20.866 (2) (zcv) *Beyond Vision; VisABILITY Center.* From the capital
17 improvement fund, a sum sufficient for the building commission to provide a grant
18 to Wiscraft, Inc., for the purchase and renovation of the VisABILITY Center specified
19 in s. 13.48 (46p). The state may contract public debt in an amount not to exceed
20 \$5,000,000 for this purpose.

21 **SECTION 4.** 20.867 (3) (cv) of the statutes is created to read:

22 20.867 (3) (cv) *Principal repayment, interest, and rebates; Beyond Vision;*
23 *VisABILITY Center.* A sum sufficient to reimburse s. 20.866 (1) (u) for the payment
24 of principal and interest costs incurred in financing the purchase and renovation of
25 the VisABILITY Center specified in s. 13.48 (46p), to make the payments determined

1 by the building commission under s. 13.488 (1) (m) that are attributable to the
 2 proceeds of obligations incurred in financing the project, and to make payments
 3 under an agreement or ancillary arrangement entered into under s. 18.06 (8) (a).

4 **SECTION 5. Nonstatutory provisions.**

5 (1) In 2019 Wisconsin Act 9, section 9104 (1), the following new paragraph is
 6 created to add the following new project to the 2019-21 Authorized State Building
 7 Program and the appropriate totals are increased by the amount shown:

(Lr) WISCRAFT, INC., D/B/A BEYOND VISION — VISABILITY

CENTER — MILWAUKEE COUNTY

borrowing:

a. Wiscraft, Inc. — VisABILITY Center	\$	\$5,000,000

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8 (2) BEYOND VISION; VISABILITY CENTER.

9 (a) Notwithstanding s. 13.48 (46p) (b), the building commission may not make
 10 a grant to Wiscraft, Inc., for the purchase and renovation of the VisABILITY Center,

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1 as enumerated in sub. (1), under s. 13.48 (46p), unless the department of
2 administration has reviewed and approved plans for the project. Notwithstanding
3 ss. 16.85 (1) and 16.855 (1m), the department may not supervise any services or work
4 or let any contract for the project. Section 16.87 does not apply to the project. Once
5 the project is completed, the department shall offer for sale under s. 16.848 the
6 existing state facilities occupied by Wiscraft, Inc.

7 (b) Notwithstanding ss. 13.48 (14) (am) and 16.848 (1), the department of
8 administration shall solicit public bids for the purchase of the existing lands and
9 facilities occupied by Wiscraft, Inc. No later than 6 months after Wiscraft, Inc.,
10 vacates those existing lands and facilities, the department of administration shall
11 sell those lands and facilities to the highest bidder. The secretary of administration
12 shall deposit all proceeds of the sale in the budget stabilization fund.
