



2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 1119

March 10, 2022 - Introduced by Representatives GUNDRUM, CABRAL-GUEVARA, DITTRICH, HORLACHER and MURPHY, cosponsored by Senators TESTIN and STROEBEL. Referred to Committee on Health.

1 **AN ACT to create** 252.05 (12) of the statutes; **relating to:** correction of inaccurate
2 communicable disease data.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, health care providers, local health officers, and laboratories are required to report certain information related to communicable disease cases to the Department of Health Services. DHS and these reporters use the Wisconsin Electronic Disease Surveillance System (WEDSS) to report this information. This bill requires DHS to correct any inaccurate health information in any electronic disease surveillance system, currently WEDSS, or other data collection system related to communicable diseases within 60 days after DHS receives verification of inaccurate information on the system.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 252.05 (12) of the statutes is created to read:
4 252.05 (12) The department shall correct any inaccurate health information
5 in any electronic disease surveillance system or other data collection system related

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SECTION 1

1 to communicable diseases that is accessible to the department within 60 days after
2 receipt by the department of verification of inaccurate information on the system.
