



2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 1168

March 10, 2022 - Introduced by Representatives HAYWOOD, SINICKI, BROSTOFF, HEBL, OHNSTAD, ANDRACA, S. RODRIGUEZ, HESSELBEIN, DRAKE, SUBECK, POPE, BOWEN, STUBBS and SHELTON, cosponsored by Senators JOHNSON, RINGHAND, ROYS and AGARD. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **AN ACT to create** 49.87 of the statutes; **relating to:** facilitating voter registration
2 for applicants for public assistance.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires that all of the following must occur in connection with each application for public assistance in Wisconsin:

1. The person receiving the application must determine whether the applicant is registered to vote.

2. If the applicant is not registered to vote, the applicant must be provided with the opportunity to register to vote online on-site and assistance in doing so.

3. If the applicant declines that opportunity, the applicant must be provided with a voter registration form and information concerning eligibility to vote, instructions for completing the form, and, unless the applicant declines in writing, assistance in completing the form. The applicant must also be provided with a written explanation of how to register to vote in person, by mail, and by electronic means.
