2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 324

May 13, 2021 – Introduced by Representatives LOUDENBECK, KNODL, SORTWELL, CALLAHAN, MURSAU, ARMSTRONG, BOWEN, BROOKS, DITTRICH, DUCHOW, EDMING, KRUG, KUGLITSCH, MAGNAFICI, MURPHY, ROZAR, SCHRAA, STEFFEN and WICHGERS, cosponsored by Senators Felzkowski, Ballweg, Marklein and NASS. 1 AN ACT to renumber and amend 103.68 (2); to amend 103.24 and 103.66 (2);

and *to create* 103.68 (2) (bm) of the statutes; **relating to:** the employment of

3 minors.

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Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain employment exceptions, no minor under 16 years of age may work before 7:00 a.m. or after 7:00 p.m. from the day after Labor Day to May 31, or before 7:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. from June 1 to Labor Day. These work hour requirements are consistent with federal law.

This bill expands the permissible work hours a minor under 16 years of age may work to not before 6:00 a.m. or after 9:30 p.m. on a day preceding a school day, and not before 6:00 a.m. or after 11:00 p.m. on a day preceding a nonschool day, when the minor is working for an employer that is not covered by the federal Fair Labor Standards Act, and whose employees are not covered by the federal Fair Labor Standards Act. Minors under 16 years of age who are employed after 10:00 p.m. must receive at least eight consecutive hours of rest from the end of one shift to the beginning of the next shift.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 103.24 of the statutes is amended to read:

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1	103.24 Hours of work. The department shall determine and fix reasonable
2	hours of employment for minors under 16 years of age in street trades. Except as
3	provided in this section, the department may not fix hours of employment for minors
4	under 16 years of age in street trades that exceed the maximum hours per day and
5	per week specified in s. 103.68 (2) (a) and (b) (am) 1. and 2. and (bm) 1. a. and b., that
6	exceed the maximum days per week specified in s. 103.68 (2) (c) (am) 3. and (bm) 1.
7	<u>c.</u> , or that begin earlier or end later than the hours specified in s. 103.68 (2) (d) and
8	(e) (am) 4. and 5. and (bm) 1. d. and e. The department may not limit the hours of
9	employment for minors 16 years of age or over in street trades or the hours of
10	employment for minors of any age who are engaged in the delivery of newspapers to
11	the consumer.

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SECTION 2. 103.66 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

13103.66 (2) The department may investigate and fix reasonable classifications 14of employments and hours of employment for minors under 16 years of age and may 15issue general or special orders fixing for those minors maximum hours of 16 employment per day and per week, maximum days of employment per week, hours 17at which employment may begin and end, and the duration of lunch and other rest 18 periods as are necessary to protect the life, health, safety, and welfare of those 19 minors. For minors under 16 years of age, the department may not fix hours of 20employment that exceed the maximum hours per day and per week specified in s. 21103.68 (2) (a) and (b) (am) 1. and 2. and (bm) 1. a. and b., that exceed the maximum 22days per week specified in s. 103.68 (2) (c) (am) 3. and (bm) 1. c., or that begin earlier 23or end later than the hours specified in s. 103.68 (2) (d) and (e) (am) 4. and 5. and (bm) $\mathbf{24}$ <u>1. d. and e</u>. For minors 16 years of age or over, the department may fix the duration 25of lunch and other rest periods, but may not limit hours of employment or issue

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general or special orders fixing maximum hours of employment per day or per week,
 maximum days of employment per week, or hours at which employment may begin
 and end.

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SECTION 3. 103.68 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 103.68 (2) (am), and 103.68
(2) (am) (intro.), as renumbered, is amended to read:

103.68 (2) (am) (intro.) No Except as provided in par. (bm), no minor under 16
years of age may be employed or permitted to work in any gainful occupation, other
than in domestic service, farm labor, or public exhibitions, as provided in s. 103.78,
as follows:

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SECTION 4. 103.68 (2) (bm) of the statutes is created to read:

11 103.68 (2) (bm) 1. Subject to subd. 2., no minor under 16 years of age working 12 for an employer that is not covered by the federal Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 USC 13 201 to 219, and whose employees are not covered by the federal Fair Labor Standards 14 Act, 29 USC 201 to 219, may be employed or permitted to work in any gainful 15 occupation, other than in domestic service, farm labor, or public exhibitions, as 16 provided in s. 103.78, as follows:

17 a. For more than 3 hours on a school day or 8 hours on a nonschool day.

18 b. For more than 18 hours in a school week or 40 hours in a nonschool week.

19 c. For more than 6 days in a week.

20 d. Before 6:00 a.m. or after 9:30 p.m. on a day preceding a school day.

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e. Before 6:00 a.m. or after 11:00 p.m. on a day preceding a nonschool day.

22 2. Minors under 16 years of age who are employed after 10:00 p.m. shall receive
23 at least 8 consecutive hours of rest from the end of one shift to the beginning of the
24 next shift.
