



## 2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 498

August 4, 2021 - Introduced by Representatives SORTWELL, TITTL, BRANDTJEN, CABRAL-GUEVARA, GUNDRUM, JAMES, KRUG, MOSES, MURPHY, PRONSCHINSKE, SUMMERFIELD, THIESFELDT, WICHGERS and TUSLER, cosponsored by Senator BRADLEY. Referred to Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety.

1     **AN ACT** *to amend* 175.60 (1) (g) and 175.60 (3) (a) of the statutes; **relating to:**  
2             minimum age to be eligible for a license to carry a concealed weapon.

***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

Current law generally prohibits an individual from carrying a concealed weapon unless the individual has a license to carry a concealed weapon that is issued by the Department of Justice. Under current law, DOJ may not issue a license to an individual who is under the age of 21. This bill lowers the minimum age requirement from 21 to 18.

***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

3             **SECTION 1.** 175.60 (1) (g) of the statutes is amended to read:  
4             175.60 (1) (g) “Out-of-state licensee” means an individual who is ~~21~~ 18 years  
5             of age or over, who is not a Wisconsin resident, and who has been issued an  
6             out-of-state license.
