## 2021 SENATE BILL 147

- February 24, 2021 Introduced by Senators Bewley, Agard, Carpenter, ERPENBACH, JOHNSON, LARSON, PFAFF, RINGHAND, ROYS, SMITH and WIRCH, cosponsored by Representatives HINTZ, ANDERSON, ANDRACA, BALDEH, BILLINGS, BOWEN, BROSTOFF, CABRERA, CONLEY, CONSIDINE, DOYLE, DRAKE, EMERSON, GOYKE, HAYWOOD, HEBL, HESSELBEIN, HONG, MCGUIRE, B. ## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under the bill, the director of the Bureau of Merit Recruitment and Selection in the Division of Personnel Management in the Department of Administration may adjust the number of hours a state employee in a limited term appointment may work during the period beginning on March 12, 2020, and ending on June 30, 2021. Under current law, a limited term appointment may not exceed 1,040 hours per year.

3 **SECTION 1.** 323.2912 of the statutes is amended to read:

4 **323.2912** Suspension of limited term appointment hours. 5 Notwithstanding s. 230.26 (1), the director of the bureau of merit recruitment and 6 selection in the division of personnel management in the department of 7 administration may increase or suspend the number of hours for a limited term
