2021 SENATE BILL 6

January 15, 2021 – Introduced by Senators WIMBERGER, STROEBEL, BERNIER and WANGGAARD. Referred to Committee on Human Services, Children and Families.

1 AN ACT relating to: requirements for a school board to close a school building 2 to in-person instruction for more than 14 consecutive days during the 2020-21 3 and 2021-22 school years and a school board requirement to offer a full-time, 4 in-person option to all pupils.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under the bill, during the remainder of the 2020–21 school year and during the 2021–22 school year, a school board may not close a school building to in-person instruction or to in-person instruction for a specific grade or grades for a period that exceeds 14 consecutive days. To extend such a closure beyond 14 consecutive days, the bill requires a two-thirds vote of the members of the school board. Under the bill, each extension may not exceed 14 consecutive days. The bill specifies that a school building is considered closed to in-person instruction if the school building is open to in-person instruction only for pupils receiving special education or related services.

This bill also requires a school board to offer a full-time, in person option to all pupils enrolled in the district by no later than 15 days after the date on which the Department of Health Services indicates that COVID-19 vaccinations may be allocated to individuals in phase 1c. of the state's vaccination prioritization guidelines. Under the bill, only upon a unanimous vote of the members of a school board, may a school board decide not to offer a full-time, in-person option to some or all pupils enrolled in the school district.

Nothing in this bill applies to a virtual charter school.

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The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

| 3 | (a) Beginning on the effective date of this paragraph and ending on June 30, |
| 4 | 2022, a school board may not do any of the following: |
| 5 | 1. Close a school building to in-person instruction for a period that exceeds 14 |
| 6 | consecutive days. |
| 7 | 2. Close a school building to in-person instruction for a grade level for a period |
| 8 | that exceeds 14 consecutive days. |
| 9 | (b) Notwithstanding par. (a), a school board may extend an action described in |
| 10 | par. (a) 1. or 2. by a two-thirds vote of the members of the school board. Each |
| 11 | extension under this paragraph may be for no more than 14 consecutive days. |
| 12 | (c) For purposes of par. (a), a school building is considered to be closed to |
| 13 | in-person instruction if a school building is open for in-person instruction to only |
| 14 | pupils receiving special education or related services. |
| 15 | (2) School board requirement to offer a full-time, in-person option to |
| 16 | PUPILS; 2020-21 AND 2021-22 SCHOOL YEARS. |
| 17 | (a) In this subsection: |
| 18 | 1. "COVID-19 vaccine" means a vaccine against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus, |
| 19 | which causes COVID-19. |
| 20 | 2. "Full-time, in-person option" means an option under which a pupil receives |
| 21 | all of his or her instruction from a school board employee who is physically present |

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in the same school building as the pupil and the regular schedule for the option is
 five-days per week.

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3 (b) Subject to par. (c), beginning on the 15th day after the date on which the
4 department of health services indicates that COVID-19 vaccines may be allocated
5 to individuals in phase 1c. of the state's vaccination prioritization guidelines, a school
6 board shall offer a full-time, in-person option to all pupils enrolled in the school
7 district.

8 (c) By unanimous vote of the members of a school board, a school board may opt 9 not to offer a full-time, in-person option to some or all of the pupils enrolled in the 10 school district.

(3) VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL; EXCEPTION. Nothing in this section applies to a
virtual charter school, as defined in s. 115.001 (16).
